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## **Executive Summary**

#### District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the ninth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

**Vision:** To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

**Mission:** With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

#### School Collection Development Plan

Metrowest Elementary School serves 620 students enrolled in Kindergarten through fifth grades. The student population's ethnicity is made up of 36% Hispanic and 64% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 47% White, 42% Black, 0% Native, 6% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 4% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Xhuljeta Gjini and Assistant Principal. Metrowest Elementary School is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include News Crew, Girls on the Run, Battle of the Books and after school tutoring.

A thorough analysis of the current Media Center collection at Metrowest Elementary School indicates that the average age of the collection is 2011 and the number of books per student is 13. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for a highly effective Media Center that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection. At this time, Metrowest Elementary School does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- 4th and 5th grade FSA ELA scores increased
- Average reading level of books is 3rd grade
- Average publication date is 2010 which exceeds OCPS average age of 2007
- Order titles suggested by the DOE list and the new B.E.S.T. Standards suggested readings
- Collection contains 31% of aged items that need to be weeded
- Collection has 1% of digital items, however, there are 1,117 eBooks, audiobooks & digital magazines available in Sora
- Items need to be ordered in non-fiction and EASY in order to meet the recommended balance of books in each section
- Purchases of new books will focus on African American students, Hispanic students and Asian students.
- Weeding will focus on aged titles in the following sections 000, 320, 360, 370, 380, 520, 570, 610 and 910.

## **Representation Analysis**

To deepen focus on strategic collection development, specific sections of the collection were analyzed in detail to determine whether the media center collection reflects and represents various points of view and experiences. The goal is to provide a balanced collection that can be both a mirror, to reflect a reader's experience, and a window, so readers can experience different viewpoints.

#### Results

Based on the available school data of Metrowest Elementary School in comparison to Collection Analysis results, it was found that:

#### Summary

After completing a deeper, targeted analysis of the representation section of the TitleWise report, it was determined that:

- Of the 225 Hispanic American titles, 37 are dictionaries and 16 are multiple copies, therefore, we are in need of Hispanic Heritage titles in order to meet our population of 36%.
- We have 390 African American titles which is 21%. We are in need of titles in order to meet our population of 42%.
